Belton—intermingled colored and white hairs

Brindle—irregular vertical bands of dark hair overlaid on lighter hair

Harlequin—spotted coloration sued specifically for the Great Dane

Hound colored—black, tan, and white with a black saddle

Merle—dark patches overlaid on a lighter background of the same pigment type: also called dapple

Parti-color—spotted

Piebald—black patches on a white background

Sable—Black-tipped hairs in which the undercoat is of lighter color

Saddle—dark patches over the back
Spectacles—dark markings around the eyes

Ticking—small flecks of coloring on a white background

Wheaten—pale yellow color

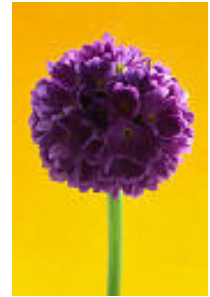
Poisons List for Dogs

This entire list is a compilation of lists from Cornell University., ASPCA, UC-Davis, Rutgers University., and Colorado State Univ. Any omissions or errors are the result of this editor compiling, and not the agency or university supplying the information.

Plant, Saddle Leaf Philodendron, Sago Palm, Satin Pothos,, Schefflera, Silver Pothos, Spotted Dumb Cane, String of Pearls, Striped Dracaena , Sweetheart Ivy Swiss Cheese Plant, Taro Vine, Tiger Lily, Tobacco, Tomato Plant (green fruit, stem and leaves), Tree Philodendron, Tropic Snow Dieffenbachia, Tulip, Weeping Fig, Wisteria, Yellow Jasmine, Yew



Also remember to keep onions, wild onions, grapes, raisins, chocolate, and baking chocolate away from your dogs. A very small amount can make your dog very sick, or could even be fatal.

Extremely toxic, and easily fatal: automobile antifreeze, Tylenol (2 Extra Strength tablets can KILL an IG), rodent poisons, weed/lawn chemicals and fertilizers, cocoa mulch, insect sprays or powders, garden chemicals and fertilizers.

Also noted: food poisoning from eating garbage, decaying carcasses or refuse found outside. Look at your kitchen, garage, bathroom and garden as if you were securing it for a toddler. Make sure cleaning products, detergents, bleach, steel wool, sponges, even cleaning rags, are all kept away or locked up from all dogs, but especially, younger dogs and puppies.

The ASPCA/National Animal Poison Control Center is the first and the only animal-oriented poison information center in North America. Since 1978, it has provided advice to veterinarians and pet owners about poison exposures.

The ASPCA/NAPCC is non-profit, however, there is a consultation fee for the service. For more information and fees, call 1-900-680-0000, or 1-888-4ani-help
